## **PTI / 2005**

### **1) Title: CRC teacher training and didactical material**

**Partner organisation:** Pestalozzi Children's Foundation, ODHAG in Central America

**Period:** June 2005 – March 2006

**Finances:** 10'000.--

**Beneficiaries:** 87 Teachers and facilitators of PCF's supported schools in Central America; approx. 18'892 Students of PCF's supported schools in Central America (didactical material)

**Objectives:**

- Teachers are sensitized and trained in issues concerning child right's and culture of peace
- Teachers integrate didactical material on child right's and culture of peace in their daily teaching activities

**Outcomes:**

- Teachers received a three day training in child rights and culture of peace and will multiply their knowledges in their educational institutions
- 27 educational institutions in 46 communities will benefit from the trained teachers
- The students will benefit from the replication activities and the didactical material
- 4 didactical materials were produced (1000 copies)

### **2) Title: Raising awareness of children's rights by making children aware of their rights**

**Partner organisation:** Community Development And Care Directorate Arad in Rumania

**Period:** 15<sup>th</sup> of September 2005 – 30<sup>th</sup> of July 2006

**Finances:** CHF 5'000

**Beneficiaries:** Social care institutions- attending children and youth, by raising their awareness of their rights, as well as, by changing the mentality of the adults - educators, social workers authority representatives

**Objectives:**

- Raising children's and adult's awareness of their rights
- Special protection of children taking into consideration their lack of physical and intellectual immaturity
- Involving the children in the decision-making process
- Sensitisation of the public opinion about the protection of children against abuse, carelessness or discrimination, as well as for respecting the rights of children, the freedom to express themselves

**Outcomes:**

- Promotion of the CRC Convention throughout the community
- Publishing of 10000 leaflets about child rights and 500 poster
- Setting up 20 statutes for 20 institutions for child protection
- Setting up 20 activity plans in institutions for child protection
- Increasing the information level about child rights among children
- Increasing the information level about child rights among adults

### **3) Title: Training Programme on CRC for Multipliers in Schools**

**Partner organisation:** Pestalozzi Foundation Romania

**Period:** October – December 2005

**Finances:** CHF 5'000.--

**Beneficiaries:** Direct beneficiaries: 60 college students which will be trained as multipliers on CRC topics in schools; indirect beneficiaries: 1000 children involved in the seminars

**Objectives:**

- To contribute to the propagation and the implementation of the CRC through multipliers in schools
- To train a group of college students to be multipliers and promoters of CRC in schools
- Involvement of young people in the implementation of the CRC

*Outcomes:*

- Training of the trainers on the topic of how to implement CRC in schools
- Implementation of the training sessions in schools

### **4) Title: Team of Child Experts**

*Partner organisation:* Children's Friends of Becej in Serbia

*Period:* January – July 2006

*Finances:* 5'000.--

*Beneficiaries:* 34 children as child rights experts, 127 pupils and 76 parents

*Objectives:* To provide basic knowledge to the Hungarian and Serbian youth about their rights in the heterogeneous community Vojvodina, Becej

- To promote mutual understanding
- To provide knowledge of CRC

*Outcomes:*

- Provision of basic knowledge about child rights in the heterogeneous community as Vojvodina, Becej
- Increasing the level of tolerance in schools and positive social perceptions of another groups of nation
- Composition of an well educated team of young experts

### **5) Title: The 12<sup>th</sup> Festival of ecological Theatre for Children**

*Partner organisation:* The 12<sup>th</sup> Festival of ecological Theatre for Children in Serbia

*Period:* April – September 2006

*Finances:* CHF 5'000.--

*Beneficiaries:* 70 youth direct and 2000 indirect beneficiaries

*Objectives:*

- Promotion of child rights (especially Article 31, CRC ( Rights of Children on free time and cultural, artist, recreations and free times activities)
- Children rights education by means of art and creativity for children and together with children and youth
- Participation of young people in various cultural activities within the entire region
- Increasing of the general level of understanding and tolerance among the youth in local surroundings region
- Development of creative youth who will create and organize the qualitative contents of their spare time by themselves in their surroundings and who will be responsible for the development of cultural happenings in our local surroundings

*Outcomes:*

- Promotion of a knowledge about child rights, rights of minorities, cultural differences
- Increasing the tolerance and positive social perception of other group of nation
- Decreasing of the degree of conflicts and discrimination

### **6) Title: The Rights To Children's Rights**

*Partner organisation:* Association for Protection and Promotion of Mental Health in Children and Youth in Serbia

*Period:* 15<sup>th</sup> of April 2006 – 15<sup>th</sup> of July 2006

*Finances:* CHF 5'000.--

*Beneficiaries:* 18 teachers and tutors, 4 volunteers who participated in the training, 2000 pupils, teachers and parents as direct beneficiaries, approximately 3000 indirect beneficiaries

*Objectives:*

- Development of the awareness of the tutors and teachers in the four institutions in Nis, about the significance of the children's rights as well as the encouragement of the tutors and teachers for the respect of those rights in every-day practice
- Promotion of the children's rights in the institutions of Nis with the realisation of the mini-project that would mark the beginning of the multiplication of the project in the educational and social institutions.
- The participation of the employees in this program would influence public awareness; change the attitude towards the children, and the publicity would indirectly influence other tutors and teachers

*Outcomes:*

- Teachers and tutors gained a knowledge about children's rights and CRC Convention
- Teachers and tutors are encouraged to apply for mini projects
- Pedagogy workers are sensitised for the protection of the children's rights
- The institution representatives collaborate during the training through exchange of visits, experiences and propositions
- Many institutions and organisations were involved in the project

### **7) Title: Affirmation of the Children's Rights Respect**

*Partner organisation:* Children's creative Centre "Mastaliste" in Serbia

*Period:* May – November 2006

*Finances:* CHF 5' 000.--

*Beneficiaries:* Direct beneficiaries: 49 young people (ages 17 - 18) from 8 Serbian towns and 8 towns from Vojvodina; 33 female and 16 male young participants, 3 adult workshop facilitators. Indirect beneficiaries: 196

*Objectives:*

- Young people learn to express their own opinion
- Young people are introduced to examples of positive common life between people of different ethnicity in Belo Blato
- Trainings during the meetings in children's rights and in media reporting

*Outcomes:*

- Connecting young people
- Producing of thirty-minute-long documentary film of the project
- Reports of the local media
- Disruption of prejudices toward people of other ethnicity
- Promotion of tolerance and cooperative common life among young people

### **8) Title: Team of Child Experts in Action – Program of Coeval Education about Child Rights on Local Level**

*Partner organisation:* Children's Friends of Becej in Serbia

*Period:* 1<sup>st</sup> of September 2006 – 31<sup>st</sup> of March 2007

*Finances:* CHF 5'000.--

*Beneficiaries:* 160 pupils from upper grade as direct beneficiaries, 50 professors and 50 parents

*Objectives:*

- To enlarge the group of young pupils cap a pie with knowledge about their rights
- To develop an interest for child rights among professors and parents
- To sensitise the local population of Becej to think about child rights
- To enable the basic team to work independent as facilitators so that they can be supervisors in the next step of education

*Outcomes:*

- Provision of a basic knowledge about child rights
- The pupils as multipliers for their school peers under the supervision of adult facilitators
- To teach the facilitators team to work independently

**9) Title: Awareness Rising on CRC**

*Partner organisation:* Norwegian Church Aid (NCA) in Lao

*Period:* 19<sup>th</sup> to 22<sup>nd</sup> of September 2006

*Beneficiaries:* 58 participants

*Finances:* CHF 5'000.--

*Objectives:*

- To raise NCA staff and partners' awareness on CRC in order to review and strengthen focus on child rights in the NCA projects in Laos and among its government partners
- To provide a solid understanding and ownership of NCA's Code of Conduct (COC) among NCA staff and raise awareness of the importance of COC among government partners

*Outcomes:*

- Sessions of CRC workshops are provided
- Incorporation of the CRC into the activities plan for 2007
- Draft guidelines for implementation of NCA code of conduct

**10) Title: Right to Culture: From the Children's Perspective**

*Partner organisation:* Proyecto Aldea Global in Honduras

*Period:* November and December 2006

*Finances:* 5'000.--

*Beneficiaries:* Children under 12 years of age, studying in public schools administrated by the community

*Objectives:* To educate "Children School Governments" to advocate for their own rights.

*Outcomes:*

- Schools governments learn how to promote their rights by taking advantage of their artistic skills and cultural features
- Parents associations join fundraising efforts and advocacy
- Children schools will be trained on advocacy
- Schools participate in the Right Campaign
- School governments present "children's perspective of development" and petition to mayors

**11) Title: Children Rights – Our Responsibility**

*Partner organisation:* Roma Serbian Friendship Stablo Kragujevac in Serbia

*Period:* December 2006 – November 2007

*Finances:* CHF 5'000.--

*Beneficiaries:* 120 youths from the high school-direct users, 30 youths of Romany nationality who have dropped out of school

*Objectives:*

- Learning and promoting basic human rights through activating young people in secondary schools
- Promoting tolerance and respect for differences, exchange of experiences, connecting children from secondary schools and learning from the experiences of others.

*Outcomes:*

- A group of young people will be trained to manage workshops on children rights
- The students and teachers will be sensitised to the problems of human rights violation and respecting the differences
- Trainers will be trained to work on education of young people to respect child rights
- Dropped out young of Romany nationality have the chance to join the education system
- The school action plan will be presented to all youth and teachers

**12) Title: Right & Culture: From the Children's Perspective**

*Partner organisation:* Proyecto Aldea Global, Honduras

*Period:* November 2006 - May 2007

*Finances:* USD 3'800 / ca. CHF 5'000

*Beneficiaries:* School Children between ages of 6 and 14 years of age. Some of them working in limestone factories, coffee and sugar cane plantations. Also, school teachers, parents associations and CSOs.

*Objectives:* To educate "Children School Governments" to advocate for their own rights.

*Note:* children selected with PAG the rights they worked with - suggestions and guidelines from PAG and PCF/ Honduras' officers were studied and incorporated.

*Outcomes:* Outcome 2 - 10 Parents associations have joined fundraising efforts and advocacy before local governments - along with key civil society organizations.

Outcome 3 - Children schools have been trained on advocacy. Children at the municipality of La Libertad have had the opportunity to present to local governments their needs from their perspective (never done before) and advocate for other projects related to them. This same activity will also take place at the municipalities of Siguatepeque and Taulabé.

*Other results:* Nine (9) schools participate in the Right Campaign in the three major cities in the region. The campaign seeks to build constituency around "related children projects" presented by civil society and advocate for their approval before community. During these events, six schools will participate with cultural activities, three more schools with marches and music and 10 schools's government will be preparing the proposal presented to the mayors.

*Advocacy:* School governments will present "children perspective of development to mayors, plus petitions and advocate for their approval. A written agreement with the signature of the mayor is one of the expected products.

**13) Title: Promoting child rights in salvadorean public schools**

*Partner organisation:* Fundacion Salvador del mundo, Fusalmo

*Period:* January 2007 – January 2008

*Finances:* USD 3800 / ca. CHF 5'000

*Beneficiaries:* 130 teachers and 60 students in Basic Public Schools

*Objectives:*

1. Train 130 teachers of 15 basic public schools in the methodology: "Promotion of child rights through the games", developed by the office of Human Rights of the Archbishop in Guatemala.

2. Adapt and reproduce the didactic materials of the methodology "Promotion of child rights through the games", to the salvadorean reality of Soyapango and San Miguel.

*Outcomes:*

1. 95 teachers as well as 62 students participating in the project were very satisfied and enthusiastic about the theme and a newly learnt methodology. The number of 130 teachers couldn't be reached because of the time of the year (end of school year) which was overcrowded with activities. Another handicap for the assistance of the teachers was the permission of the MoE which did not allow to participate in trainings taking place during school lessons.

2: The students were very creative and enthusiastic during the process of creating the three stories which were designed as two stories and one comic. It was reached that they could really transform their daily living experience by elaborating the stories.

#### **14) Title: Juvenile network for the protection of children and adolescents**

*Partner organisation:* Asociación Programa de Atención, Movilización e Incidencia por la Niñez y Adolescencia PAMI in Guatemala

*Period:* January – December 2007

*Finances:* CHF 5'000.--

*Beneficiaries:* 50 (boys and girls) working children and teenagers (NNATs), 60 NNATs parents attending to the Proyecto Semilla School of Parenthood, 2200 children, adolescents and citizens

*Objectives:*

- To contribute for the protection of working children and adolescents of Panajachel's area, against any act of violence, specially in human trade of children and teenagers, for sexual exploitation, through the application of the strategies of training, social mobilization, advocacy and communications

*Outcomes:*

- Awareness about by the juvenile network about sexual exploitation
- Production and distribution of bulletins, radio spots and posters
- Training of the network members in artistic expression
- Development of communitarian activities of artistic projection and expression
- Participation of the town community and other key actors

#### **15) Title: Children are the future**

*Partner organisation:* Roma education network; ARC "Vrama si" in Macedonia

*Period:* 1<sup>st</sup> of February – 1<sup>st</sup> of March 2007

*Finances:* 5'000.--

*Beneficiaries:* 470 Roma and Macedonian children as direct users and 1000 children's as indirect users

*Objectives:*

- Familiarizing the children and the wider public, with children's rights
- Increasing the public awareness for respecting the children's rights
- Creating a foundation for equality and respecting the differences

*Outcomes:*

- Children and the wider public are familiarized with the children's rights
- Increasing of public awareness for respecting child rights
- Establishing the Foundation for equality and respect the differences

**16) Title: Promoting child rights in salvadorean public schools**

**Partner organisation: Fundacion Salvador del mundo, Fusalmo**

*Period:* January 2007 – January 2008

*Finances:* USD 3800

*Beneficiaries:* 130 teachers and 60 students in Basic Public Schools

*Objectives:*

*Period:* From 15. Jan. to 30. June 2007

*Finances:* CHF 4'700

*Beneficiaries:* Good response of the participants of the seminar, important for the participation on the promotion of children rights. Total number – 17.

120 ( 4 classes from the school)

7 peer educators that took part in the workshops

2 teachers that took part in the workshops

7 Activists who took part in the workshops

17 young Roma who do not go to school who took part in the workshops

153 total number of users ( young, teachers and activists)

*Objectives:* Good response of the participants of the seminar, important for the participation on the promotion of children rights.

*Outcomes:* Informing and teaching young people about the Convention on human rights  
Motivation and participation of the young so that they can contribute through their own activities to:

- raising awareness of the young how much each of them can contribute to the realization of their rights and also to realize that the more rights they have the greater their responsibility is not to endanger rights of others.
- young people, teachers and activists taking part in situations that are usually the source of conflict that can be solved without violence if they are ready to listen to each other, accept arguments of the other part and understand their needs and feelings.

Organization of the workshops among young in the secondary school, creating the contents of the workshops,

- Young people actively taking part and influencing the teachers to respect more young peoples' rights so that they can solve the school problems together
- Getting to know the young, teachers and activists and using the techniques of problem analysis, demonstrations of information types that can be acquired that way and their importance for the further planning
- Motivating them to find persons, groups that are important for their campaign and to have them in mind when planning future activities
- Organization of the activities with young people actively taking part and participation of the local community representatives

**18) Title: CRC clubs, country programme, Systematizing CRC interventions in PCF supported projects**

*Partner organisation:* PCF Ethiopia

*Period:* September 2007 – September 2008

*Finances:* CHF 10'000.--

*Beneficiaries:* PCF supported projects

20 Project coordinators/education officers

37 CRC clubs in the seven projects (institutionally )

5'000 children

400 community members

75 government officials

*Objectives:* CRC clubs and child forums are functioning effectively

Gender equity in all the project activities is promoted

Discussion forums that contribute towards improving knowledge on the problems facing children is established

Preventive measures against harmful practices like early marriage and abduction are promoted

*Outcomes:* Project coordinators/education officers of PCF supported projects a total of 20 people are trained and can :

-identify and work out relevant guidelines for establishing CRC clubs and child forums in the ABE centres

-train selected facilitators, teachers in the ABE centres (know how transfer)

-The community members and policy makers become proactive in taking measures against harmful traditional practices

-Children become proactive in articulating issues that concerns them

-The sustainability of the intervention in the seven projects is ensured through periodic follow up training workshops given by CLPC

-Project staff of CLPC gain experience on Child right issues in the rural areas. Win win situation .

*Period:* 3. 6. September 2007

*Finances:* USD 4'068

*Beneficiaries:* 60 participants (12 government partners, 7 volunteers and 41 NCA staff), of which 22 were women. The participants are between 20 to 54 years of age.

*Objectives:* To review and strengthen the focus on child protection in NCA projects in Lao PDR.

*Outcomes:* Women and Child Protection Policy disseminated to staff, partners and volunteers of NCA.

### **20) Title: Shadow report to UN Child Rights Committee**

**Partner organisation: Uzice Child Rights Centre, Serbia**

*Period:* January 1- April 30 (2008)

*Finances:* Euro 1'423 / ca. CHF 2'280

*Beneficiaries:* PCF and all PCF partners in Serbia

*Objectives:* The main project objective is to raise awareness on situation on the rights of a child in Serbia and to advocate for child rights.

*Outcomes:* Short term: All PCF partners in Serbia as well as PCF directly involved in preparation and presentation of shadow report and gave significant contribution to the report. Long term: All PCF partners in Serbia as well as PCF clearly recognized as child rights based organizations.

### **21) Title: Child Rights Training**

**Partner organisation: Uzice Child Rights Centre, Serbia**

*Period:* January – April 2008

*Finances:* Euro 2'900 (ca. CHF 4'640)

*Beneficiaries:* 17 participants in total: 3 Country coordinators (from Serbia, Romania and Macedonia) and 2 management staff from each PCF's Operational partners from each of three countries (7 operational partners/14 persons in total).

*Objectives:* The main project objective is to develop the capacities of participants in issues of child rights and to support implementation of Child Rights based approach in all projects in South-East Europe region supported by PCF

*Outcomes:* Short term: All participants well introduced to the Convention on the Rights of a Child as well as to the child rights issues in general and able to transfer knowledge and principles of child rights into their local, national and regional projects and activities and further develop capacities of their organizations in issues of child rights.

Long term: All programs and projects supported by PCF in SEE region incorporated child rights approach which is in accordance to PCF's new strategy.

### **22) Title: CRC, Children's participation programme development**

**Partner organisation: Save the Children Norway, Lao PDR**

*Period:* March 2008 - ?

*Finances:* USD 3'600

*Beneficiaries:* It is planned that the materials will be distributed to primary schools in the project target areas supported by SCN, especially in LuangPrabang and Bolikhamsay. It will be used for the Children and Youth Radio programme in disseminating CRC and for outreach activities with youth in communities.

The immediate recipients of the materials are primary school students and young people at the youth radio programme. The extended audience of the CRC messages is children and youth audience of the radio programme.

*Objectives:* The specific objective of the production of CRC materials is to make CRC information accessible for children and youth. It is a response to the lack of child rights materials in Lao language that is friendly for children and youth. It is also to make a contribution to the fulfillment of the right of children to have access to information.

*Outcomes:* Children and youth in and out of school have better understanding of their rights.

*Objectives:* Tag des Kindes als stiftungsübergreifendes Thema, das die Einbindung von Mitarbeitenden und Kindern/Jugendlichen aus möglichst vielen Bereichen und Abteilungen der SKP gewährleistet, Bekanntmachung der Kinderrechte, Miteinbeziehen der Öffentlichkeit

*Outcomes:* Aufführung von Theaterstück, Vorträge/Kurse zu spezifischen Themen, Erstellung eines Konzepts

### **3) Title: Brücken bauen. Ein Handbuch zur Interkulturellen Pädagogik**

*Partner organisation:* SKP, Interkultureller Austausch

*Period:* Februar 2007 – Mai 2008

*Finances:* CHF 10'000

*Beneficiaries:* Lehrer/innen, Pädagog/innen und Multiplikator/innen im Deutschsprachigen Raum

*Objectives:* In der interkulturellen Erziehung, Friedenspädagogik, Umweltarbeit, etc. gibt es die unterschiedlichsten Kurse, Seminare etc., welche friedliches Verhalten, Toleranz, Sozialkompetenz, Kommunikationsfähigkeit, etc. lehren.

Auch im Rahmen der pädagogischen Aktivitäten der SKP werden Kurse dieser Art angeboten. Die Antragstellerin geht ausserdem davon aus, dass die meisten dieser Themen

unter das Dach der Menschen- oder Kinderrechte subsumiert werden könnten. Beispielsweise bezieht sich ein Anti-Rassismustraining auf den Anti-Diskriminierungsgrundsatz, ein Selbstsicherheitstraining auf das Recht eines gewaltfreien Lebens, usw.

Daraus ergaben sich zwei Ziele:

1. Verdeutlichen dieses Zusammenhanges
2. Zusammenfassung der unterschiedlichen Themen unter einem Dach, um ihren inneren Zusammenhang zu verdeutlichen
3. Verbreitung solcher Methoden in schulischen und anderen pädagogischen Zusammenhängen
4. Befähigung von LehrerInnen, PädagogInnen und MultiplikatorInnen, solche Methoden ausführen zu können

Die SKP steht für einen Childrights approach ein und sucht immer wieder neue Mittel und Wege, diesen sowohl nach Aussen ins gesellschaftliche Umfeld, als auch nach Innen für die MitarbeiterInnen der SPK im In- und Ausland zu kommunizieren und unterschiedlichste Menschen dazu zu motivieren.

5. Schaffung eines Mediums, diesen Transfer unabhängig von Personen, die oft für pädagogische Prozesse stehen, flächendeckend zu gewährleisten.
6. Das Medium sollte auch in ressourcenarmen Umgebungen zu verwenden sein.
7. Den Transfer motivierend zu gestalten, um die Eigeninitiative der Nutzniesser zu fördern.

*Outcomes:* Alle genannten Ziele wurden durch die Veröffentlichung erreicht.

Verbreitung partizipativer Methoden innerhalb und ausserhalb SKP

Förderung der Vermittlung normativer Kursinhalte, welche für unterschiedliche Schwerpunkte in den Kinderrechten stehen, wie Diskriminierungsverbot (Anti-Rassismuskurs), Religionsfreiheit (Kurs zur Interreligiösen Kompetenz) etc.

#### **4) Title: Tag des Kindes in der SKP**

*Partner organisation:* Team Interne Schule

*Period:* August - Ende November 2007

*Finances:* CHF 4'629

*Beneficiaries:* Kinder und Jugendliche der internen Schule (ca. 15)

Kinder und Jugendliche des Wohnens (die extern in die Schule gehen, ca. 15)

Kinder und Jugendliche vom Austausch (ca. 80) + Betreuer/innen(ca. 12)

Mitarbeitende der SKP (ca. 50)

Total ca. 170 Personen

*Objectives:* Jugendliche der internen Schule gestalten den Tag des Kindes. Sensibilisierung der Jugendlichen und Erwachsenen zum Thema Kinderarbeit.

*Outcomes:* Es war ein gelungener Anlass, bei dem sich Jugendliche und Mitarbeitende der SKP in verschiedener Art und Weise begegnen konnten. Diese Art trägt auch zum guten Arbeitsklima in der SKP bei.

Es hat eine Sensibilisierung zum Thema Kinderrechte und Kinderarbeit stattgefunden.

Die Planung und Durchführung des Projekts hat auch das unterschiedliche Verständnis von Projektleitung und -durchführung innerhalb der SKP aufgezeigt (im Konkreten zwischen der Schule und der Fachstelle Kinderrechte). Diese Erkenntnisse wurden in das Konzept "Tag des Kindes 2008 - 2011" aufgenommen.

#### **5) Title: Lebensbuch Biografiearbeit**

*Partner organisation:* SKP, Bereich Wohnen

*Period:* Juni 2008 – Juni 2009

*Finances:* CHF 5'000

*Beneficiaries:* Kinder und Jugendliche, Pädagog/innen, Lehrer/innen SKP

*Objectives:* "Wer die Vergangenheit ängstlich verdrängt, wird kaum mit der Zukunft im Reinen sein".

Oftmals fehlen Kindern und Jugendlichen mit Beziehungsabbrüchen die einfachsten Basisinformationen. Viele fremdplatzierte Kinder, also unsere Kinder und Jugendlichen, spüren keinen sicheren Boden unter den Füßen, sie sind psychisch nicht genug verortet. Das Ausfüllen eines Lebensbuches hilft ihnen, verlorene Teile ihrer selbst wieder zugänglich zu machen, Verwirrung umzuwandeln in Gewissheit (nach Irmela Wiemann, Familientherapeutin und Autorin). In diesem Sinn dient die Herstellung eines "Lebensbuches" das an jedes Kind, jeden Jugendlichen abgegeben wird und das er mit Hilfe seiner Bezugsperson ausfüllt, als Unterlage für die Biografiearbeit.

*Outcomes:* Drucken des Lebensbuches in 200 Exemplaren
